### Impacts of COVID-19 on carer-employee's

Undergraduate Jerry Wu is studying computer science at the University of Waterloo. During his first co-op term, he worked as a Data Analyst at the McMaster School of Geography and Earth Sciences, specializing in research related to the health and

wellbeing of carer employees. Jerry used statistical software to analyze large cross-sectional data sets like the GSS, and used regression models to find the relationship between caring, health, and work. Jerry has written two recently published papers on this work.



# Work, Women and Caregiving

There are roughly 3.5 million working Canadians who, in addition to their employment, also provide unpaid caregiving for a loved one. The majority of those working carers are women. In honour of **International Women's Day**, the Canadian Hospice Palliative Care Association (CHPCA) hosted a conversation on the role of employers in supporting carers in the workplace with Dr. Allison Williams from McMaster University and Cathy McCallion from Ross Video.

This conversation brought academic and corporate perspectives together to discuss the benefits for employers who provide support for working carers, best practices and common hurdles to implementing supportive HR policies, the latest research findings on these issues, and the impacts of caregiving on working women's lives. **Watch the recording HERE.**

#### Sethi & Williams: Ottawa & Portugal

The 7<sup>th</sup> World Conference on Qualitative Research took place in late January 2023 in Portugal. Researchers Bharati Sethi and Allison Williams presented their study titled: "Arts-Based Multimodal Ethnography in Researching Culturally Diverse Transnational Carers in Ontario, Canada". This study explores the experiences of immigrant and Indigenous Transnational Carer-Employees (TCEs) in Ontario, Canada. TCEs are individuals who reside and work in Canada while providing informal care to adult loved ones elsewhere, either on reserve or another country.

The 25<sup>th</sup> Metropolis Canada Conference, which emphasizes conversations around migration, took place in March 2023 in Ottawa, Ontario. Researchers Bharati Sethi and Allison Williams presented their study titled: "Racialized Immigrants Experiences of Caregiving Across International Borders". Little research has explored how immigrants in Canada balance employment while supporting families in their native countries. Qualitative interviews with 21 racialized immigrants reveal the economic and emotional challenges related to transnational care. This study's insights can inform culturally responsive resettlement and work programs to foster the integration of immigrants.

In this study the objective is to develop an inventory of carer-employee competencies for HR Professionals. The competencies for those professionals refer to the cluster of related knowledge, skills, abilities, and other characteristics (KSAOs) defined in terms of observable behaviours needed for success in oversight of carer-employees (i.e., Carer-employee Competencies for Human Resources Professionals (CCHRP)).
